## Several Original Tuskegee Airmen to participate in Little Rock Event

MPCATA hosts its 2nd Annual Awards Banquet and Birthday Celebration for 95-year old Arkansas native Tuskegee Airman Alum, Milton P. Crenshaw

LITTLE ROCK—Aviation and aerospace professionals and supporters from across the nation will gather at the Mosaic Templars Cultural Center in Little Rock on Saturday to celebrate the 95th birthday of Arkansas native and original Tuskegee Airrman, Milton P. Crecnchaw while calling attention to the need for increased minority representation in the aviation and aerospace industry. The event will also honor several fellow Tuskegee Airrmen and includes a special new documentary presentation featuring Crenchaw.

Founded in 2009, the Milton Pitts Crenchaw Aviation Training Academy (MPCATA) believes that no one should have to forego their dreams to become a professional in the aviation and aerospace industry due to a lack of financial support. As a result, MPCATA works to identify and mentor students in underserved and disadvantaged communities in order to provide educational opportunities related to those particular industries – as well as other STEM\* fields as appropriate – at an early age. (\*STEM = Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics)

Milton Pitts Crenchaw, of the original Tuskegee Airmen, was one of the first African Americans in the country and the first from Arkansas to be trained by the federal government as a civilian licensed pilot. He trained hundreds of cadet pilots while at Alabama's Tuskegee Institute in the 1940s and was the catalyst for the first successful flight program at Philander Smith College in Little Rock AR (1947-1953). His combined service record extends over forty years of federal service from 1941 to 1983 with the U.S. Army Air Corps and later the U.S. Air Force. Born January 13, 1919, Crenchaw is one of the oldest surviving Tuskegee Airmen members.
