TUSKEGEE UNIVERSITY HISTORICAL SKETCH

Tuskegee University is an independent and state-related institution of higher education. Its programs serve a student body that is coeducational as well as racially, ethnically and religiously diverse. With a strong orientation toward disciplines which highlight the relationship between education and work force preparation in the sciences, professions and technical areas, Tuskegee University also emphasizes the importance of the liberal arts as a foundation for successful careers in all areas. Accordingly, all academic majors stress the mastery of a required core of liberal arts courses. Tuskegee University ranks No. 1 among all 309 baccalaureate colleges in the U.S. as reported in the September-October 2011 issue of *Washington Monthly*.

Tuskegee University is located in Tuskegee, Ala., which is 40 miles east of the Alabama State Capitol in Montgomery, Ala., and 20 miles west of the city of Auburn, Ala. It is also within easy driving distance to the cities of Birmingham, Ala., and Atlanta, Ga.

The academic programs are organized into seven colleges/schools: 1.) Andrew F. Brimmer College of Business and Information Science, 2.) College of Agriculture, Environment and Nutrition Sciences, 3.) College of Arts and Sciences, 4.) College of Engineering, 5.) College of Veterinary Medicine, Nursing and Allied Health, 6.) Robert R. Taylor School of Architecture and Construction Science, and 7.) School of Education.

Graduate instruction leading to the master's degree and Doctor of Philosophy degree is offered in six of the seven colleges.

The university is accredited by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS); and the following programs are accredited by national agencies: architecture, business, education, engineering, clinical laboratory sciences, nursing, occupational therapy, social work, and veterinary medicine. Of special note is the fact that Tuskegee University is the only independent, historically black university with four engineering programs that are nationally accredited by the Accreditation Board of Engineering and Technology (ABET), the major accrediting body for the engineering sciences. Also, Tuskegee University's chemistry program is one of only a few at Historically Black Colleges and Universities that is approved by the American Chemical Society. Furthermore, the dietetics program is approved by the American Dietetic Association and the food science program is approved by the Institute of Food Technologists.

Tuskegee University was the first black college to be designated as a Registered National Historic Landmark (April 2, 1966), and the only black college to be designated a National Historic Site (Oct. 26, 1974), a distinction administered by the National Park Service of the U. S. Department of Interior.

Special features in Tuskegee University's program include: the General Daniel "Chappie" James Center for

Aerospace Science and Health Education, honoring America's first black four-star general who was a Tuskegee University graduate, and housing the nation's only aerospace science engineering program at an HBCU; the media center in the School of Veterinary Medicine, with state-of-the-art video up-link and down-link, intra-school communications, audio/visual, graphics, photography and document production; the Kellogg Hotel and Conference Center at Tuskegee University, a state-of-the-art hotel and meeting facility for educational, business and cultural events; and the Tuskegee University National Center for Bioethics in Research and Health Care, a distinctive research, teaching and outreach program that addresses issues of ethics and public policy in the treatment of people of color and rural Americans in health care.

Other special features that enhance the educational and cultural environment of the university include: the Booker T. Washington Monument, "Lifting the Veil," which honors the university's founder; George Washington Carver Museum (named for the distinguished scientist who worked at Tuskegee), which preserves the tools and handiwork of Carver; Tuskegee Archives, a chief center for information on the challenges, culture and history of black Americans since 1896; Tuskegee Airmen's Plaza, commemorating the historic feats of America's first black pilots, who were trained at Tuskegee University; our Reserve Officers Training Corps (ROTC) programs have graduated more African-American generals and admirals than any university in the U.S., including the military service academies; National Center of Academic Excellence in Information Assurance for 2012-2017; and a Center of Excellence for Research on Nano-Biomaterials.

Over a century since it was founded by Booker T. Washington in 1881, Tuskegee University has become one of our nation's most outstanding institutions of higher learning. While it focuses on helping to develop human resources primarily within the African-American community, it is open to all.

Tuskegee's mission has always been service to people, not education for its own sake. Stressing the need to educate the whole person, that is, the hand and the heart as well as the mind, Washington's school was soon acclaimed — first by Alabama and

then by the nation for the soundness and vigor of its educational programs and principles. The solid strength has continued through the subsequent administrations of Dr. Robert R. Moton (1915-1935), Dr. Frederick D. Patterson (1935-1953), Dr. Luther H. Foster (1953-1981), Dr. Benjamin F. Payton (1981-2010), Dr. Gilbert L. Rochon (2010-2013). On June 15, 2014, Dr. Brian Johnson officially took office as the university's seventh president.

Tuskegee enrolls more than 3,000 students and employs approximately 900 faculty and support personnel. Physical facilities include more than 5,000 acres of forestry and a campus on which sits more than 100 major buildings and structures. Total land, forestry and facilities are valued in excess of \$500 million.

TUSKEGEE UNIVERSITY 7TH PRESIDENT



Dr. Brian Johnson is the seventh President of Tuskegee University. He has held administrative and academic posts in the following capacities: Vice President for Strategic Planning & Institutional Effectiveness, Assistant Provost for Academic Affairs, Associate Vice President for Academic Affairs, Chief of Staff, Director, Coordinator and Associate and Assistant Professor of English. He received a Ph.D. in 17th-19th Century American literature at The University of South Carolina at Columbia (2003), a M.A. in English from The University of Wisconsin-Madison (1998) and a B.A. in English from Johnson C. Smith University (1995).

Among several administrative and academic fellowships, he has been named a (2012-2013) (A.C.E.) American Council of Education Fellow (Indiana University Purdue University-Indianapolis Chancellor's Office/IU Lilly Family School of Philanthropy), a (2012-2013) (A.A.S.C.U.) Association of American Schools and Colleges and Universities Millennium Leadership Initiative Fellow, a (2011-2012) Tennessee Board of Regents Maxine Smith Fellow (Tennessee Higher Education Commission), a (2011-2012) (C.C.C.U.) Consortium of Christian Colleges and Universities rising senior administrative (MELDI) Fellowship, a (2006-2007) Woodrow Wilson/Career Enhancement Sabbatical Fellow, a (2006-2007) Civic Engagement Scholar within the J. McDonald Williams Institute-Dallas, Texas, a (2005-2007) Lilly Foundation/Center for Christian Studies Fellow (Gordon College, Wenham, MA), a (2004-2005) non-resident fellow within the W.E.B. Du Bois Institute for African and African American Studies (Harvard University) and a (2003-Present) Andrew W. Mellon-Benjamin Mays Postdoctoral Fellowship.

Dr. Johnson is also the editor and author of (7) academic and scholarly books: (2) books on William Edward Burghardt Du Bois, *W.E.B. Du Bois: Toward Agnosticism* (2008) and *Du Bois on Reform: Periodical-based Leadership for African Americans* (2005); co-editor of (4) volumes on American History in the *Conflicts in American History Series* (2010)--*Volume 3: Civil War, Volume 4: Reconstruction, Volume 7: The Long Civil Rights Movement and Volume 8: Towards the Next American Century*; author of (1) institutional history of a historically black college and university—his alma mater, Johnson C. Smith University—titled, *The Yancy Years: the Age of Infrastructure, Technology and Restoration* (2008).

In August 1995, Dr. Johnson published an article, the (Raleigh) News and Observer titled, "A Young Man Apart, A World Apart," which describes his experiences hailing from inner-city Durham, North Carolina. Academic Heraldry

In a tradition passed down from the Middle Ages, academic regalia worn during commencements symbolize the essence of educational pageantry. Academic dress originated during the 12th and 13th Centuries, with the establishment of European universities. By the second half of the 14th Century, England began defining academic dress.

The long gowns and hoods may have been necessary for warmth in medieval buildings. As the statutes evolved, the traditional English costumes were incorporated into American colleges and universities in the 19th Century. Rapid growth of those institutions in the United States led to a standardized assignment of colors for the various fields of learning.

Representatives of major institutions formed an intercollegiate commission to establish a suitable academic code of dress. The commission met at Columbia University in 1895 and adopted the Intercollegiate Code, which regulates the cut, style, colors and materials for each part of the academic costume to be used for bachelor's, master's and doctoral levels. The code was revised in 1932 by the American Council on Education and again by a committee appointed by the Council in 1959. The code was updated in 1986.

Gowns

Materials, trimmings and sleeves of gowns vary by discipline. Black is the recommended color. Gowns for the bachelor's or master's degrees are untrimmed. The sleeves of the bachelor's degree gown, which is always worn closed, are pointed. The master's degree gown has oblong sleeves that are open at the wrist. The doctor's degree gown features velvet facing down the front and three bars of velvet across the bell-shaped sleeves. The velvet trimmings may be black or the color distinctive of the degree's discipline. Master's and doctoral gowns may be worn open or closed.

Hoods

The academic costume's most distinctive feature, hoods must be black and made of the same material as the gown. The hood identifies both the degree level and the institution conferring the degree. The length of the hood worn for the bachelor's degree must be three feet, for the master's degree, three and one-half feet, and for the doctor's degree, which may have panels at the sides, four feet. Lined with the official colors of the college or university conferring the degree, only the highest degree is represented on the hood. The color of the velvet edging indicates the subject to which the degree pertains and measures three inches for the master's degree and five inches for the doctor's degree.

Cap

The square black mortarboard is recommended, and the material may be cotton poplin, broadcloth, rayon or silk to match the gown. Doctor's degree caps may be velvet with gold tassels. Tassels, which should be black or the color appropriate to the subject, should be fastened to the middle point of the top of the cap only and lie as it will.

Important Terms to Remember

alumna - Use this singular term for a female graduate.

alumnae - Use this plural term for a group of female graduates.

alumni - Use this plural term for former

students or graduates, whether referring to a group of males or a group consisting of males and females. This term should never be used in reference to a single individual.

alumnus - Use this singular term for a male graduate.

alma mater - A term that may be used when referring to Tuskegee University, the university from which you graduated.

TNAA - Acronym for Tuskegee National Alumni Association, Inc.

Michelle Obama

First Lady of the United States of America



When people ask First Lady Michelle Obama to describe herself, she doesn't hesitate to say that first and foremost, she is Malia and Sasha's mom.

But before she was a mother — or a wife, lawyer, or public servant — she was Fraser and Marian Robinson's daughter.

The Robinsons lived in a brick bungalow on the South Side of Chicago. Fraser was a pump operator for the Chicago Water Department, and despite being diagnosed with multiple sclerosis at a young age, he hardly ever missed a day of work. Marian stayed home to raise Michelle and her older brother Craig, skillfully managing a busy household filled with love, laughter, and important life lessons.

A product of Chicago public schools, Michelle Robinson studied sociology and African-American studies at Princeton University. After graduating from Harvard Law School in 1988, she joined the Chicago law firm Sidley & Austin, where she later met Barack Obama, the man who would become the love of her life.

After a few years, Mrs. Obama decided her true calling was working with people to serve their communities and their neighbors. She served as assistant commissioner of planning and development in Chicago's City Hall before becoming the founding executive director of the Chicago chapter of Public Allies, an AmeriCorps program that prepares youth for public service.

In 1996, Mrs. Obama joined the University of Chicago with a vision of bringing campus and community together. As Associate Dean of Student Services, she developed the university's first community service program, and under her leadership as Vice President of Community and External Affairs for the University of Chicago Medical Center, volunteerism skyrocketed.

Mrs. Obama has continued her efforts to support and inspire young people during her time as First Lady.

In 2010, she launched *Let's Move!*, bringing together community leaders, educators, medical professionals, parents, and others in a nationwide effort to address the challenge of childhood obesity. *Let's Move!* has an ambitious goal: to solve the epidemic of childhood obesity within a generation. Whether it's providing healthier food in our schools, helping kids be more physically active, or urging companies to market healthier foods to our children, *Let's Move!* is focused on giving parents the support they need to make healthier choices for their kids.

In 2011, Mrs. Obama and Dr. Jill Biden came together to launch Joining Forces, a nationwide initiative calling all Americans to rally around service members, veterans, and their families and support them through wellness, education, and employment opportunities. Joining Forces works hand in hand with the public and private sector to ensure that service members, veterans, and their families have the tools they need to succeed throughout their lives.

In 2014, Mrs. Obama launched the Reach Higher Initiative, an effort to inspire young people across America to take charge of their future by completing their education past high school, whether at a professional training program, a community college, or a four-year college or university. Reach Higher aims to ensure that all students understand what they need to complete their education by working to expose students to college and career opportunities; helping them understand financial aid eligibility; encouraging academic planning and summer learning opportunities; and supporting high school counselors who do essential work to help students get into college.

As First Lady, Mrs. Obama looks forward to continuing her work on the issues close to her heart — supporting military families, helping children lead healthier lives, and encouraging all our young people to fulfill their boundless promise.

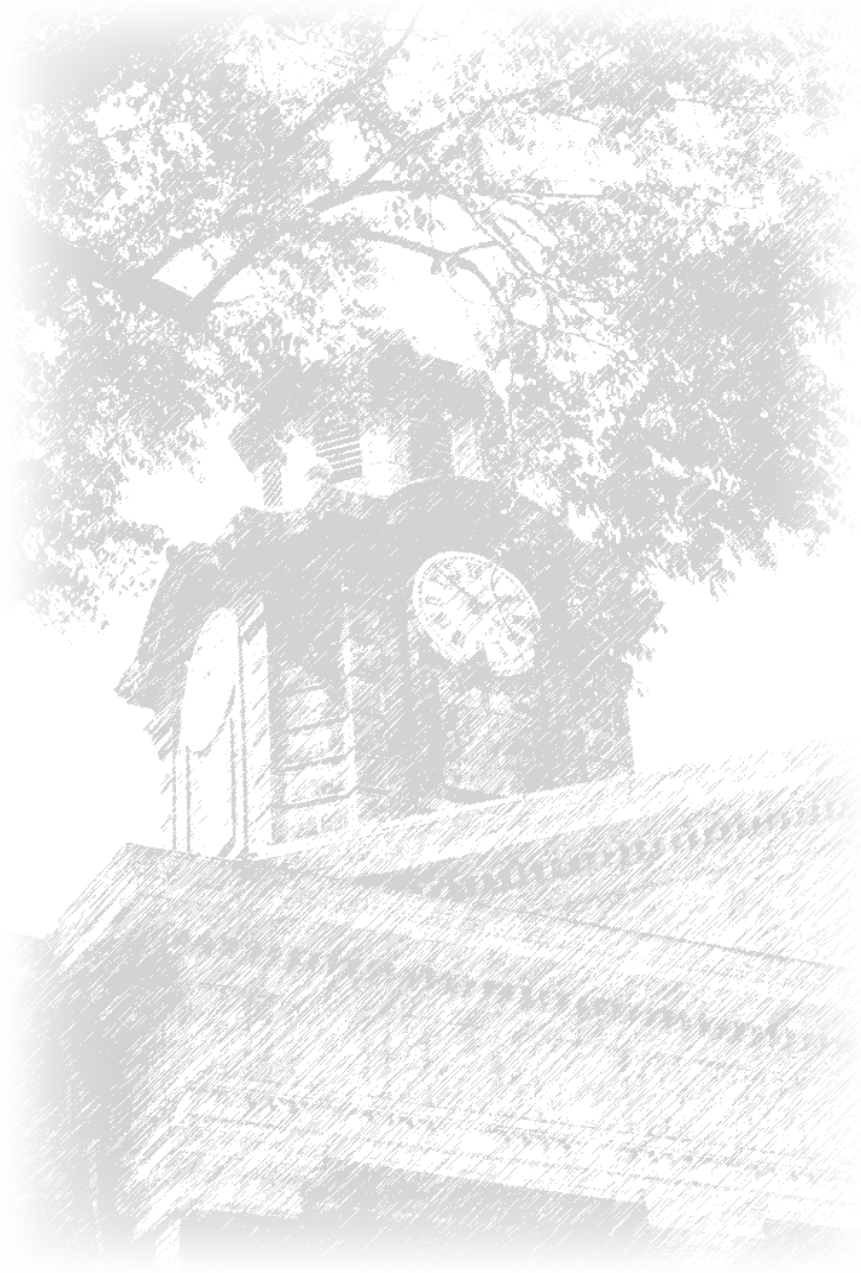
